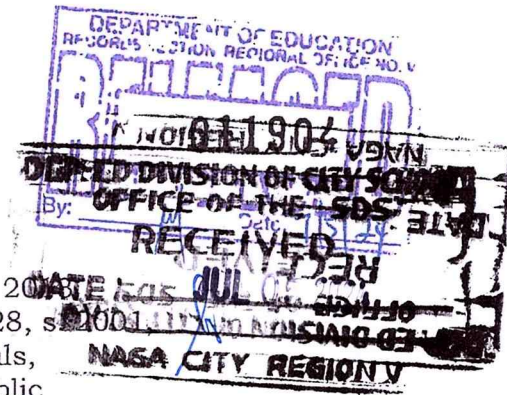

The SEAIP-2024 conference is being co-hosted by the University of the Philippines Baguio, Pambansang Samahan ng Sikolohiyang Pilipino (PSSP), the Southeast Asian Indigenous Psychology (SEAIP) network, and Monash Malaysia Culture and Health Lab.

This event is a continuation of our efforts to empower young scholars in the Southeast Asian region who are interested in indigenous psychologies by building a community in which collaborative efforts and multidisciplinary research on culturally relevant issues may be fostered and supported. As such, this scientific meeting includes plenty of opportunities for dialogue, networking and collaboration, including (1) an open-session with keynote speaker, Professor Grace H. Aguilin Dalisay, and two plenary speakers, Professor Jose Antonio R. 
